<u>Simon Baxter</u> Capturing the Experience and Emotion of Woodlands Saturday, January 16, 2021 – 4 p.m. (Live from Scotland via Zoom videoconference)



Discovering the therapeutic benefits of being creative amongst trees has been life changing for Scottish photographer Simon Baxter. In his quest for wellbeing, Simon developed a passion for exploring local woodlands. which evolved into an endeavor to make images that show the very best of these special places and communicate his connection to them. He will share some thoughts and insights into how he sees within these complex worlds and how that vision has changed with time.



<u>Autumn Bland</u> Portraits of a Pandemic—An Evolving Project Wednesday, February 17, 2021 – 7 p.m. (Live via Zoom videoconference)

Ohio photographer Autumn Bland's initial project to take portraits of those affected by the COVID pandemic evolved as the world changed through 2020. The project became more expansive in its representation of the community through views of essential workers who were required to keep the economy operating and those forced away from their normal work. Autumn will discuss the evolution of the project and how followup sessions became more important. She also will talk about the logistics of photo sessions during a pandemic and her artistic choices to accomplish her goals.



#### <u>Marie Read</u> Capturing the Spirit of Birds Wednesday, March 17, 2021 – 7 p.m. (Live via Zoom videoconference)



Professional photographer and author Marie Read will share a fun and informative mix of avian natural history as it pertains to bird photography, plus field craft, strategies and technical information to help you improve your bird photography. In addition, there will be lots of great photos, including many from her new book, "Mastering Bird Photography: The Art, Craft and Technique of Photographing Birds and Their Behavior."



<u>Judy Semroc</u> Hiding in Plain Sight: Amazing Patterns of Camouflage & Mimicry in Nature Wednesday, April 21, 2021 – 7 p.m. (Live via Zoom videoconference)

Judy's program will show images and discuss examples of how animals and plants mislead and deceive in order to survive in nature. Photographic images will show both macro-level details and large-scale patterns that help to hide/protect species. Be prepared to test your observation skills!

#### <u>Betsy Banks</u> The Magic of Acadia National Park Wednesday, May 19, 2021 – 7 p.m. (Live via Zoom videoconference)



Join us for a celebration of the beauty of the Maine coast and Acadia National Park. Betsy was one of the coordinators of the 2015 CVPS road trip to Acadia and, in anticipation that CVPS may be able to run another trip this fall, she will share information about the park, locations to shoot, and why Acadia is such a beautiful and inspirational destination for photographers.

The Photo Walks for 2021 will be planned by CVPS member Jerry Jelinek. Following our pandemic guidelines that limit gathering as a group, Photo Walks are generally announced two weeks prior to the online critique to allow you to visit the location on your own schedule (perhaps more than once). Photographers are encouraged to submit their three favorite images for an online critique by Jerry.
